# REPORT OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

The annual report presented to members of the Association on the occasion of the Thirty sixth Annual General Meeting held at the Grace land Casino, Secunda on Thursday 12 February 2015.

#### STRATEGIC PROCESS

Your Council has continued to focus on the Association becoming an effective role player in the Coal Mining Industry. This process would be ongoing as the Council wished to ensure that the Association was effectively marketed and participated in the preparation of new legislation, Codes of Practice as well as safety targets and milestones set by the Mining Industry.

A strategic planning session was held in February 2014 to set out the Association's interaction with its various stakeholders during 2014.

The following priorities were identified and progressed through the year:

- Influencing Policy
- Skills Security
- Communication and Engagement
- Participation and Value
- Technical content
- SACEA Governance

As part of the process the Council issues a communication sheet after each meeting for circulation to Heads of Engineering and members.

The Council met with the Heads of Engineering from the major Mining Houses to discuss the Associations' strategic plan in January 2014 and then again in May 2014 to align itself with the objectives of each of the Mining Houses. This intervention continues to grow in importance and provides a unique opportunity to network with the Mining Houses representatives. The Council also met with the Engineering Managers in April 2014 for the first time.

#### **FINANCE**

The financial statements appended to this report indicate that income for the year amounted to R 1, 570,168 made up of subscriptions received during the year from Full and Student members, Presidential function, interest received from investments, Mini workshops, the successful technical symposium, race day and golf day.

Expenditure amounted to R 1.495,857 giving a surplus of R 74,311. Accumulated funds of R 571,116 will be carried forward to the new financial year.

The successful technical symposium in June 2014 continues to generate funds for the Association and thanks go to Mr M E Thuesen, and his small but highly motivated team for making it a continued success.

As part of the Association's objectives a successful golf day was held in November 2014 which generated a surplus of R 88,211 and a first Race day which generated R 41,228. The events also

promoted fellowship amongst members. The Council thanks Mr L D Botha for his excellent work in making the golf day so successful.

Two mini safety workshops were held in June and October 2014 replacing the traditional annual safety seminar.

This year the surplus was used to partly fund the Presidential function in line with the Association's decision not to solicit sponsorship from outside organisations for the Presidential functions.

The accumulated funds have been used to fund the Association's initiatives on the position of the certificated engineer, licensing, registration as well as an amount donated to charity. The Council regularly strategises on how to make best use of the surplus for the general advancement of the Association.

### **SUBSCRIPTIONS**

In terms of the Powers vested in it by the Association's Constitution and Rules, Council has agreed not to increase the annual subscriptions for the ensuing year (2015) for Full, Affiliate and candidate members, these will remain at R1080 (exclusive of VAT).

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

The membership of the Association as at 31 December 2014 was 391 (379), made up of 191 (196) Full members, 45 (35) Affiliate members, 136 (134) Candidate Members, 4 retired members and 15 (14) Honorary Life members.

There has been a net increase of 12.

Council records that the percentage registered with ECSA as full members (having voting rights) still complies with ECSA's requirement for SACEA to be recognized as a voluntarily Association with ECSA. However a number of members need to join ECSA and others to upgrade their ECSA membership from candidate to full members.

Membership certificates are issued to new members of the Association on a regular basis at Regional Meetings.

## **MEETINGS**

In addition to the monthly meetings of Council, regular Regional Meetings were held during the year and feed-back from members through their Regional Representatives and Council members, provided valuable assistance to the workings of Council. The increased involvement required by your Council in a number of important areas meant that nine Council meetings were held during the course of the year.

During the year under review, Kwazulu Natal Regional and Limpopo Regional meetings were combined with those of the South African Colliery Managers' Association. The Limpopo Region continues to gather momentum under the guidance of Mr. J Sithole.

The Council and the Regional Meetings, a General Meeting and Joint Meetings with AMRE and SACMA were well supported during the year and shows the commitment by members to the Association.

Once again your President was invited to attend Council Meetings of the South African Colliery Managers' Association and wishes to thank its President, Mr R Chinamatira for assisting in maintaining close ties between the two Associations.

The User Groups (Underground and Plant) had a successful year with regular meetings and several technical visits. The Opencast User Group unfortunately only managed to meet once this year which is disappointing, but a new Chairman has been identified for the coming year. Each User Group has a Council appointed Chairperson who ensures regular meetings and visits of interest.

#### **YOUNG TALENT**

The SACEA Young Talent forum which was established in 2012 continued its good work through the efforts of Ms C Booyens and Mr L Delport ensuring that SACEA is a prominent Association which created value to Engineering Professionals in training (PIT's) in 2014.

Technical visits and GCC workshops during the year were arranged to assist PITs with gaining exposure, signing off Annexure E requirements and networking.

#### INTERMINE TECHNICAL VISITS

Council will continue to seek out interesting and diverse technical visits for members, providing them the opportunity to experience other companies operations.

There were a number of Technical visits arranged as part of the Underground, Opencast and Plant Users meetings.

#### **MEETINGS OF PRESIDENTS AND VICE-PRESIDENTS**

These meetings provide the management of the Mine Professional Associations Secretariat (MPAS) to manage and organize the day to day work of MPAS under the guidance of the Chairman, Mr A Brown of AMMSA, as well as a useful forum where matters of mutual interest and concern have been addressed with the meeting being held every second month not only twice a year..

#### SAFETY AND HEALTH

## MINE SAFETY ACHIEVEMENTS

The Association through Council continues to place a high priority on safety improvements, risk assessment and the elimination of accidents. Reports by members are made at all Association meetings and the DMR is invited to Regional meetings to address members.

Congratulations to the management and staff of all the mines who had safety achievements during 2014. These achievements will be acknowledged on 12 March at Coalsafe 2014.

#### MINI SAFETY WORKSHOPS

The Council agreed on a new initiative to replace the annual safety workshop with a series of mini safety workshops focused on topics needing urgent intervention. There were two mini workshop in the year; Earthing and lightening protection on 12 June 2014 and flameproof repairs on 16 October 2014. Papers presented included Installation and Commissioning of a lightening Protection and Earthing system by H H Kanwischer from HHK, Earthing and Lightening Protection by J Van Straten and A Bezuidenhout from Surgetek and Flame proofing repairs typical deviations found by P Prinsloo from Sasol, A guideline for Ex D Equipment repairs as required by ARP0108 and SANA 60079-19 by David Maree from Explolabs, Comparison of the IECEX service scheme vs RSA markscheme requirements by R Viljoen from MASC, SAFA Responsibility of the repair facility by P Meanwell from SAFA and Legal Requirement and implications of non-conformance by A Coutinho from DMR. A comprehensive discussion session followed the presentations which was also very beneficial to delegates.

#### 2014 COLLIERY HEALTH AND SAFETY CAMPAIGN (COALSAFE)

Your Association has once again been actively involved in the 2014 Colliery Safety and Health Campaign launch which took place on 16 April 2014 and remains fully committed to the Campaign's ideals for the promotion of safety and health in the Mining Industry.

#### **MINESAFE 2014**

Your Association also took part in the Minesafe 2014 at Emperors Palace in October 2014. Minesafe 2014 was the fourth joint collaboration of hard rock and coal mines on safety, occupational hygiene, environment and community, ending with presentations of safety achievements.

## Regulation of Engineering Professional practitioners in the SAM&MS

- The MPA Steering Committee has for a number of years played a very important role in developing the final draft Stage 2 (Quality Council for Trades and Occupations (QCTO)) qualifications for the professional development of certificated Managers and Engineers in the SA Mining and Minerals Sector which is now completed. This was achieved through the Council's' effective participation in numerous relevant initiatives and External Forums.
- With the majority of work done the Council decided to suspend further work and reassess its future involvement though the Steering committee which has been placing a financial burden on the Association. The Council together with the SACMA Council will consider what areas need to be addressed in 2015 and whether this could be done with collaboration with the Chamber of Mines, ECSA and MQA.

## THE ENGINEERING COUNCIL OF SA (ECSA)

Your Association continues to play a very active role as a recognised Voluntary Association within ECSA.

The Association continues to meet its Voluntary Association status with ECSA and was granted its renewal of its VA status for a further 5 years in 2014.

## OCCUPATIONAL, HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY COMMITTEE (OH&SPC)

The Council would like to thank Messrs J Diedericks/J Malan for attending and their contribution.

The main focus of this committee is to represent employer bodies at a Chamber level on redrafting of legal requirements and other issues that may affect the Industry.

One of the focus areas was the representation of the Industry at the DMR to review the requirements of the conveyor regulations which were subsequently gazetted during the year

# SENTINEL RETIREMENT FUND

The Association has actively participated and regularly received updates on performance through the South African Colliery Administrative and Financial Managers' Association's elected Trustee on the Sentinel Retirement Fund.
